Abstract: The records were generated by the business activities of the Indian Arts Fund (IAF), now part of the Indian Arts Research Center, a division of the School for Advanced Research (formerly School of American Research) in Santa Fe, New Mexico. The collection spans the IAF founding in 1922 to its merger and dissolution in 1972. The original goal of the IAF was to collect and preserve both ancient and modern Indian art. Files in the collection consist of administrative documents, reports, publications, a large amount of correspondence, financial records, a few photographs, and extensively detailed accession books of IAF collected art objects. Prominent figures involved with the IAF include Kenneth M. Chapman, Margretta S. Stewart, H. P. Mera, Betty Toulouse, Mary C. Wheelwright, George Bloom, Stanley Stubbs, John Gaw Meem, and Amelia Elizabeth White. Many organizations and businesses in Santa Fe and across the country were associated with the IAF during its decades of operation, such as trading posts, museums, and art galleries, particularly the Museum of New Mexico and the Laboratory of Anthropology.

History

The Pueblo Pottery Fund was founded in 1922, incorporating as The Indian Arts Fund, Inc. in 1925, with the goal "to encourage and promote Indian Arts among the Indians of New Mexico and elsewhere; to preserve, improve, and to revive their ancient arts and crafts; to collect and to preserve ancient and modern specimens of Indian arts of every character; to perpetuate and disseminate Indian art in all its phases and manifestations..." In 1972, the Indian Arts Fund dissolved and merged its collections with the School of American Research. The collection has moved from its beginning in the home of H.P. Mera to the basement of the Fine Arts Museum, Sena Plaza, the Laboratory of Anthropology, back to the Fine Arts Museum basement, then returning to the Laboratory of Anthropology and, finally, to the Indian Arts Research Center at the School for Advanced Research in 1978.

Scope and Content

Files include articles of incorporation, by-laws, minutes of meetings (1922-1972), correspondence, gift acknowledgements, history and chronology, merger with the Museum of New Mexico, contract with the Laboratory of Anthropology, and memorial collections or funds for Margretta Dietrich, Stanley Stubbs, and Kenneth Chapman. Also included are original bills for the purchase of objects (arranged by store or trading company) and accession books with notations and sketches of the art designs, many drawn in color ink by Kenneth Chapman. There are separate books or pages for pottery, paintings, ceremonial objects, silver, and textiles. There are photographs from the New Deal period program, the Public Works of Art Project, New Mexico Division, which cover Pueblo pots and potters as well as Indian artists and paintings. Researchers searching for people or businesses will want to consult the separate finding aid, "AC 01 Index to Folders", for an exhaustive list of names in the records.

Arrangement

The collection is arranged into seven series: Series 1: Administrative documents, 1925-1972; Series 2: History of the Indian Arts Fund (IAF); Series 3: Correspondence, 1924-1973; Series 4: Financial records, 1922-1972; Series 5: Art collections; Series 6. Photographs for the Public Works of Art Project; Series 7. Museum plans. Most of the records, including the correspondence, were organized chronologically, with dates in the folder titles. When this collection was first processed, a card file of names and terms was created and indexed by folder number and a timeline of events was drafted. Both of these original finding aids have been transcribed and retained for researchers (see pdf documents "AC 01 Index to Folders" and "AC 01 Timeline"). During the subsequent writing of this guide, the collection was intellectually arranged into series and subseries, but the physical arrangement and folder titles left as is.
